



25th Endurance Regularity Rally «24 Hours Greece»

22-23 October 2022

Peloponnese - Central Greece

In 1998, the one of its kind endurance rally for historic cars, the "24 Hours Greece"-rally, was organized for the first time. A rally that, with its continuous 25-year presence, managed to melt hearts and acquire fanatic followers. The "24 Hours Greece" was established through incredible routes, night adventures and heroic efforts, which built the legend of this unique rally.

On the 22nd of October, the 25th edition of "24 Hours Greece" starts. Ninety war-ready crews will start at 10 in the morning from Corinth towards Ag. Ioannis, Athikia, Lyrkeia, Douka Vrysi, Karteri, Mati and Vytina, where the first regroup will take place. Magoulia, Valtasiniko, Dimitsana, Tropaia, Kontovazaina, Lampia and Patras will follow, where the three-hour regroup and the finish of the "12 Hours of Greece"-Trophy will take place. At 11pm the floodlights will be switched on and the night section will start, which has given a gothic character to this adventurous rally. The determined crews will pass from the Peloponnese to Central Greece, will continue to Analipsi, Rigani, Nafpaktos, Efpalio, Teichio, Stillia, Milea, Amygdalea and will stop for an one-hour of regroup in Galaxidi. At dawn, Desfina, Steiri, Agia Anna, Kaparelli, Plataies, Dafni and Fyli will bring the gladiators to the Acropolis of Athens for the finish. The award ceremony will traditionally take place on Monday 24 October at 8pm.

The "24 Hours of Greece" endurance rally aims at well-prepared crews, who want to experience a 24-hour adventure on the legendary routes of Greece. The race is held under FIVA regulations on open to traffic, yet remote roads.

- All certified historic cars over 30 years are accepted, as well as "youngtimers" 20-29 years old. Safety measures (eg roll cage) are not required but are acceptable.
- A racing license is not required, but a driving license for the driver, insurance for the car and roadside assistance are mandatory.
- The duration of the race from start to finish is 24 hours and in between there will be 2 one-hour stops as well as a three-hour regroup. The distance to be covered is 800 km and the participants will compete in approximately 20 special stages, with satellite timing & live results.
- Those who want to live this unique experience, but do not want to overestimate their powers, may compete in the Touring Trophy category & the "12 Hours of Greece"-Trophy. Slightly less mileage and selectively lower average speeds have been taken into consideration for this category.
- To carry out the special stages, sophisticated navigation instruments are not required, while a good odometer & a stopwatch are sufficient. All distance, time or navigation instruments are eligible! All distances, average hourly speeds and timing points of special routes are announced in advance.

The closing date for entries is Friday, October 14, while the deadline for entries with a reduced fee ends on Friday, September 23.
