



26th Endurance Regularity Rally «24 Hours Greece»

21-22 October 2023

Central Greece - Thessaly

"24 Hours Greece" is the only endurance rally for historic cars that started in 1998 and with its continuous 25-year presence managed to build a unique legend and acquire fanatic followers.

On October 21, the 26th edition of the renewed "24 Hours Greece"-rally starts. The hospitality of the Friends of Historic Vehicles of Volos (FIO) together with special stages of the "Kentavros" rally will frame beloved and new special stages of Central Greece and will mark the new era of "24 Hours of Greece"-rally. Up to ninety well prepared crews have the right to participate, who will start at 10:30 in the morning from the always welcoming promenade of Chalkida, heading for Paralimni, Loutsi, Kirtoni, Atalanti, Modi, Regini, Rahes and Paralia Pelasgias, where the first regroup will take place. Glyfa, Pteleos, Koukourava, Portaria and Volos promenade will follow, where the glamorous three-hour regroup and the finish of the "12 Hours of Greece"-trophy will take place. At 11:30 in the evening the lights will be turned on and the night section towards the legendary routes of the mountain of the Centaurs will begin. The special stages of Paleokastro, Vyzitsa, Milies and Drakeia will lead the crews to Almyros, from where the night adventure will continue to Neraida, Anavra and Neos Palamas in the direction of Lamia for a final one-hour regroup. At dawn, Bralos, Apostolias, Amfikleia, Haironeia & Ritsona will bring the gladiators to the promenade of Chalkida for the finish. The price giving ceremony will take place on Monday, October 23 at 8 pm.

The "24 Hours of Greece" endurance rally addresses to well-prepared crews, who want to experience a 24-hour adventure on the legendary routes of Greece. The race is held under FIVA regulations on open to traffic, yet remote roads.

- All certified historic cars over 30 years are accepted, as well as "youngtimers" 20-29 years old. Safety measures (eg roll cage) are not required but are acceptable.
- A racing license is not required, but a driving license for the driver, insurance for the car and roadside assistance are mandatory.
- The duration of the race from start to finish is 24 hours and in between there will be 2 one-hour stops as well as a three-hour regroup. The distance to be covered is 800 km and the participants will compete in approximately 20 special stages, with satellite timing & live results.
- Those who want to live this unique experience, but do not want to overestimate their powers, may compete in the Touring Trophy category & the "12 Hours of Greece"-Trophy. Slightly less mileage and selectively lower average speeds may be taken into consideration for this category.
- To carry out the special stages, sophisticated navigation instruments are not required, while a good odometer & a stopwatch are sufficient. All distance, time or navigation instruments are eligible! All distances, average hourly speeds and timing points of special routes are announced in advance.

The closing date for entries is Thursday, October 12, while the deadline for entries with a reduced fee ends on Thursday, September 21.
