

28th «24 Hours Greece» Endurance Regularity Rally

18-19 October 2025 Peloponnese, Tripolis

The endurance regularity rally "24 Hours of Greece" returns to the mountains of the Peloponnese on October 18 & 19 for the 28th consecutive year. The "24 Hours of Greece" was first held in 1998, built its legend over the years and has gained fanatic followers. SISA, with the hospitality of the Municipality of Tripolis and the support of EKO, continues a tradition where the passion for the historic car & demanding driving are the main ingredients.

Up to ninety battle-ready crews with historic cars & youngtimers are eligible to participate. They will start on Saturday, October 18 at 10:30 in the morning from Loutraki towards the mountainous area of Corinth and via Mosia, Lykouria will arrive in Kleitoria, where the first re group will take place. The 2nd leg will head towards Tripotama, Velimachi and via Dimitsana & Stemnitsa will end at the main square of Tripoli, where the 4-hour re group of the "24 Hours of Greece" and the finishing of the "12 Hours of Greece" trophy will take place.

Each section of the route has been designed to combine challenge with safety and beautiful landscapes with the heritage of the "24 Hours of Greece" Rally. The night section marks the climax of the event. Thus, half an hour after midnight, the headlights will turn on and the special stages of Mainalo will take place, continuing to Valtetsiniko, Agridi and back to Tripoli for the final re group. At dawn, the final challenge of the "24 Hours of Greece" continues, where through the special stages of Douka Vrysi, Nemea & Korinthia the warriors will finish in Loutraki.

The awards ceremony will take place on Monday, October 20 at 8pm at the Hellenic Motor Museum.

- The endurance regularity rally "24 Hours of Greece" is aimed at well-prepared crews who want to experience a unique adventure on legendary routes. The race is held on remote & open to traffic roads, where a good odometer & a stopwatch are sufficient. All distance, time or navigation measuring instruments are free (there are restrictions in the Classique category).
- All certified historic cars over 30 years old are accepted, as well as "youngtimers" 20-29 years old. Roll cages & roll bars are not necessary, but are acceptable.
- A racing license is not required, but it is necessary to have a driving license for the driver and co-driver (if driving), car insurance as well as roadside assistance.
- The duration of the race from start to finish is 24 hours and in between there will be 2 one-hour stops as well as a four-hour re group for rest. The distance of the 4 legs is 800 km and the participants will compete in approximately 25 special stages, with satellite timing, GPS tracking & live results publication.
- The "12 Hours of Greece" trophy & the Classique category are intented for those who want to experience this unique endurance rally of historic cars, but do not want to overestimate their strength in night driving.
